¹³ They brought to the Pharisees the man who had been blind. ¹⁴ Now the day on which Jesus had made the mud and opened the man's eyes was a Sabbath. ¹⁵ Therefore the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. "He put mud on my eyes," the man replied, "and I washed, and now I see."

- ¹⁶ Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath."
- But others asked, "How can a sinner perform such signs?" So they were divided.
- ¹⁷ Then they turned again to the blind man, "What have you to say about him? It was your eyes he opened."
- The man replied, "He is a prophet."
- ¹⁸ They still did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they sent for the man's parents. ¹⁹ "Is this your son?" they asked. "Is this the one you say was born blind? How is it that now he can see?"
- ²⁰ "We know he is our son," the parents answered, "and we know he was born blind. ²¹ But how he can see now, or who opened his eyes, we don't know. Ask him. He is of age; he will speak for himself." ²² His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders, who already had decided that anyone who acknowledged that Jesus was the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue. ²³ That was why his parents said, "He is of age; ask him."
- ²⁴ A second time they summoned the man who had been blind. "Give glory to God by telling the truth," they said. "We know this man is a sinner."
- ²⁵ He replied, "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!"

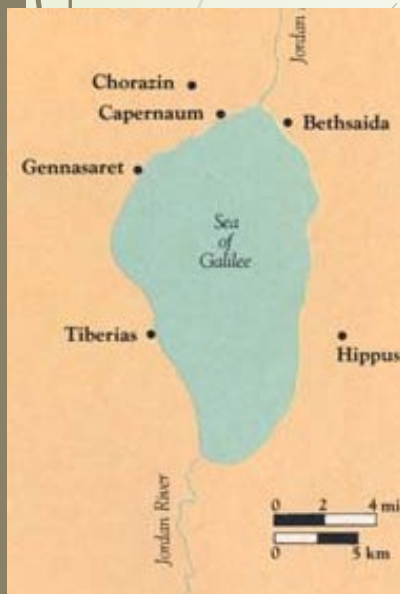
John 9 Continued

- ▶ ²⁶ Then they asked him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?"
- ▶ ²⁷ He answered, "I have told you already and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples too?"
- ▶ ²⁸ Then they hurled insults at him and said, "You are this fellow's disciple! We are disciples of Moses! ²⁹ We know that God spoke to Moses, but as for this fellow, we don't even know where he comes from."
- ▶ ³⁰ The man answered, "Now that is remarkable! You don't know where he comes from, yet he opened my eyes. ³¹ We know that God does not listen to sinners. He listens to the godly person who does his will. ³² Nobody has ever heard of opening the eyes of a man born blind. ³³ If this man were not from God, he could do nothing."
- ▶ ³⁴ To this they replied, "You were steeped in sin at birth; how dare you lecture us!" And they threw him out.
- ▶ **Spiritual Blindness**
- ▶ ³⁵ Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"
- ▶ ³⁶ "Who is he, sir?" the man asked. "Tell me so that I may believe in him."
- ▶ ³⁷ Jesus said, "You have now seen him; in fact, he is the one speaking with you."
- ▶ ³⁸ Then the man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him.
- ▶ ³⁹ Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the blind will see and those who see will become blind."
- ▶ ⁴⁰ Some Pharisees who were with him heard him say this and asked, "What? Are we blind too?"
- ▶ ⁴¹ Jesus said, "If you were blind, you would not be guilty of sin; but now that you claim you can see, your guilt remains."

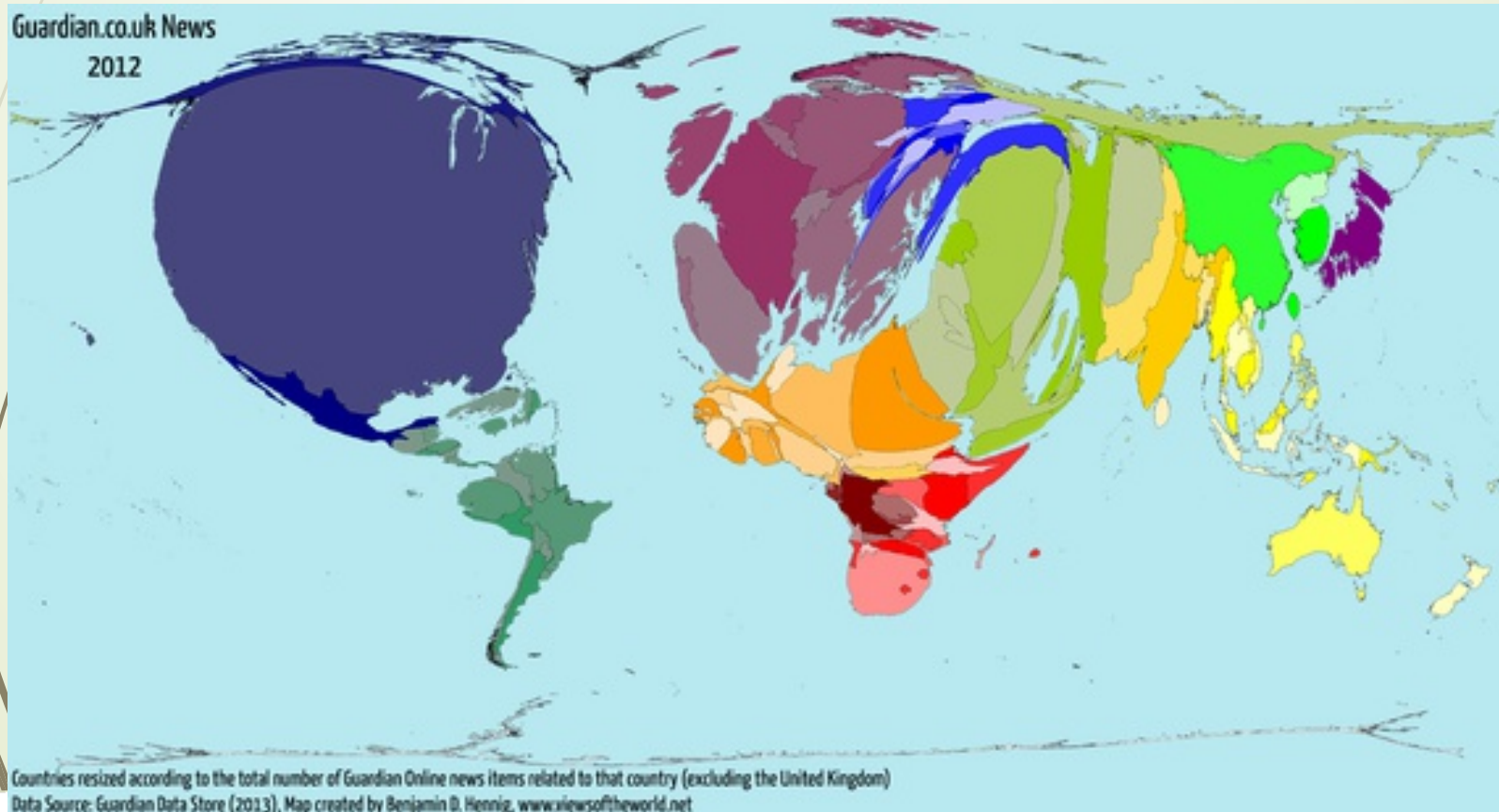

Components of Corporate Character



Negative

- ▶ **Having and accepting Poor Priorities:** Our Priorities must be set by God, but if we are not careful we will either have our own agendas, or let the agendas of others or institutions create them for us.

Positive

Creating Healthy Priorities: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together Heb 10:25, Speaking to each other in spiritual songs,

Components of Corporate Character

Negative:

- Carnality: Being Lukewarm like the Laodicean church of Rev 3:14-22. Being like the world, and mixing our Walk and practices with world. These three towns were still Jewish towns, but in the time of the Roman occupation, there were many gentiles in the region and it was known to have many gentiles, one reason many gentiles came to Jesus during this time, but he was sent to the house of Abraham. Some archeological research suggests that in the synagogues of this region, there were often sculptures of Medusa on the walls. Things of the world sneak in, and Miracles don't overcome them.

Positive:

Turning to God via healthy interdependent discipleship- seeing what to do , not just majoring in the don'ts. Being Like Rahab or Ruth or Daniel. Free from guilt and shame but sold out for God

Components of Corporate Character

➤ Negative

- **Spiritual Blindness:** Not knowing one is blind: Loosing one's senses- deafness & blindness to Spiritual things, causing misattribution. John 9:35-41. This is troublesome because one can't tell they are blind. This is why God can make the wise seem foolish, they don't know they are foolish in their pride. This often leads to lack of appreciation of what is right in front of your face- Like gifts and miracles. Instead of praising God for the gifts and singing songs for the miracles, you filter them around traditions, fitting in, other self centeredness etc. rather than truly seeking God. There is a great curse on the wise and the gifted if they seek their own way- Hell is a Place for the creature(s) who were the most gifted and should know better to be punished

Positive:

Getting regular spiritual check ups with People we trust, and then getting the Spiritual Glasses, Lasik etc. needed to see clearly: Not knowing one is blind: praising God for the gifts and singing songs for the miracles. We sometimes think negatively of discipline here, but we need to discipline those we love to help them come to their senses quickly.

The connection between Individual and Corporate Character:

➤ ¹⁵ Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. ¹⁶ For all that is in the world, **the lust of the flesh** and **the lust of the eyes** (Comfort- getting what we want (or see around us) to make us “happy”) and **the boastful pride of life**, (and pride in our achievements and possessions (New Living Trans) is not from the Father, but is from the world. ¹⁷ The world is passing away, and *also* its lusts; but the one who does the will of God lives forever.

How the Battle of Character plays out

Battle ground	As Individual	Local Church National/World Church	An example: Samson
Out –Agenda (Whose), <u>World- Dangerous Environment</u>	- The lust of the flesh/ world- our agenda, or if we don't have one the Culture's agenda will fill the void. Our flesh is the environment we make decisions	Carnality of Thought- the Belief that it is ok for the Church to look like the world.	Samson Represented God's people- gifted, but distracted by the world. He wanted "other" women. Hebrew women weren't good enough.
In- Comfort (Whose) <u>Flesh- Internal Enemy</u>	Personal Selfishness, greed, covetousness- the Lust of the eyes.	Phariseeism- The belief that is Ok to focus on what our personal views of righteousness are. Priority on the wrong things. Sin vs. redemption for example	Samson was pretty much beyond correction. He was given over to his flesh so he was blind to what was important. His priority should have been killing Philistines instead he was dating them.
Up/Down- Focus <u>Satan- External Enemy</u> (Selfishness to the extreme)	Pride of Life- Satan's biggest sin. Pride/ focus in/on our achievements and possessions. Being given over to Satan, allows this pride to go to the extreme and it steals, kills and destroys us.	Satan- Who hinders God's kingdom in us, unless we resist. He attacks the Church's agenda and unity around it (Galatians), Economy, and health.	Pride did him in, and Satan attacked him where he was weak- through women. God had to reach him by making him blind- like he did with Paul. That reboot is sometimes essential for winning our battles. Selfishness and Pride were stripped and God used a defeat to make the selfish, selfless.

A Case Study of Individual/ Corporate Character : Homosexual Marriage

Battle Front	Poor/ Evil/ Defeated Individual Responses	Poor/ Evil/ Defeated Body Responses
World (Carnal agenda)	“Everybody’s doing it” They seem to be happy on modern Family, and I love that show, did you see when..., and did you see Scandal last night..,	It is more than OK, it is God’s plan because He is love. We should be welcoming and affirming of everyone.
Flesh (Individual/ Pharisee comfort)	“Homosexuals are Ok with <u>me</u> so it is fine, it is not worth a battle and I will be uncomfortable dealing with it” Another fleshy view- though Opposite “I hate Queers, God will destroy them in Hell!” This is just as wrong if not moreso!	Let’s make it a higher than it needs to be priority and denounce it because deep down <u>we</u> just don’t like LGBT community- they are a threat to <u>our</u> way of life and political agendas.
Satan (Selfishness)	This goes against God’s plan, so let’s promote it, and give it to individual Pharisees types to focus on it in the culture instead of discipleship of the body and sharing the Gospel with the world.	Let’s distract the church from it’s call to make disciples, weaken their interpretation of the Word and divide them so they tear each other apart.



What did Jesus Give us for Culture Building

1. His life and Words as teaching and example.
2. His challenge to make disciples
3. His routines- Baptism and Communion
4. His Spirit- To comfort, guide
5. His Body- The church body to guide worship and service. Other churches also serve as examples and warnings. Rev. 2-4. The Church of Sardis, Philadelphia, Laodicea for example.
6. His Priorities- The greatest commandment, to be the greatest you must serve, etc.
7. His Sufferings and challenges. Show me your faith/Character without works, and I will show you my faith by my works. Rahab as an example. Persistence in the face of challenge is part of Character... God allowed some churches to struggle- Why? Because that is how we overcome. Being Lukewarm can come from not appreciating the Lord, or not appreciating Miracles like the Churches Jesus condemned.



Discussion Questions (1st part of Sermon)

1. Why do you think God judges those who should know better more harshly? Can you think of times when you have done this?
2. We often think of repenting as turning away from sin, rather than turning away from independence and self centeredness. The Pharisees didn't see much sin to turn away from, but were focused on their agenda so much so they couldn't see that their agenda was not God's. Can you think of a time when you may have done this or been hurt by such a mindset.
3. Thanksgiving is a corporate event, where we give thanks as a family. What is the power of cooperate thanks, prayer, worship? How can we create a culture where this is more common in a culture that is so individualistic?
