Acts 8:1-3

- **8** Saul was in hearty agreement with putting him to death.
- And on that day a great persecution [a]began against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles. ² *Some* devout men buried Stephen, and made loud lamentation over him. ³ But Saul *began* ravaging the church, entering house after house, and dragging off men and women, he would put them in prison.

- I. You will be my witnesses from Judea to Samaria to the uttermost parts of the world... (Acts 1:8)
Remember your old Testament ... Reverse order redemption... Sent to Whole world (Adam and Eve) and Adam and Eve fall, then to Israel (Samaria and Judea), Samaria falls, then Judah falls... Go to Judea- New name of Judah, Samaria and the uttermost parts of the Earth.

WILSON LEAVES PARIS; SAILS SUNDAY GERMANS PLEDGED TO ACT IN GOOD FAITH

CITY'S BELLS RING TIDINGS AS PEACE TREATY IS SIGNED; FLEET JOINS IN CELEBRATION

Flagship Pennsylvania in Hudson Fires Salute of 21 Guns as Men "Dress Ship."

Star-Spangled Banner Flies From Fleet in North River as Bands Play.

The firing of a salute of seventeen guns from the 8-inch battery of the super-dreadnought Pennsylvania, flagship of Admiral H. T. Mayo, in the North River, gave official announcement to New York City of the signing of the Treaty of Versailles, ending the greatest war of the world. Flag and megaphone signals carried the news of the salute to the other vessels of the Atlantic fleet, which are now "dressed ship." BEST DAY IN HISTORY SINCE BETHLEHEM, SAYS SECRETARY OF THE NAVY

Danah Orders Every Ship and White Salute of 21 Guns for Peace.

WASHINGTON, June 28.—SUMMARY DANIELS, secretary of the navy, today said this morning is the best day in the history of the world since the angels sang in Bethlehem. "It is in the highest, on Earth Peace, Good Will Toward Men."

"We are living the fulfillment of that prophecy. As a republic we are grateful to have borne a part in making straight and plain the path of progress, peace with justice to the world. From the crumpled shreds of signing of the Treaty of Peace, the most important document in the history of the world, every ship and shore gunning will fire a salute of seventeen guns with the

TREATY SEVERE ON GERMANY, SAYS WILSON, BUT IMPOSES NOTHING SHE CANNOT DO

President in an Address to the American Public Says It Furnishes a Charter for a New Order and Ends Rule of Selfish Groups

WASHINGTON, June 28.—An hour on the signing of the Peace Treaty was devoted from Versailles today the following address by President Wilson was heard from the White House:

"My Fellow Countrymen: The Treaty of Peace has been signed. It is a treaty that will furnish the charter for a new order of affairs in the world. It is a severe treaty in the duties and penalties it imposes upon Germany, but it is severe only because the great wrongs done by Germany are to be righted and repaired. It imposes nothing that Germany cannot do, and she can regain her rightful standing in the world by the prompt and honorable fulfillment of its terms.

"And it is much more than a treaty with Germany. It liberates great peoples who have never before been able to find the way to liberty. It ends, once for all, an old and insupportable order under which small groups of selfish men could use the people of great empires to serve their own ambition for power and dominion.

"It associates the free governments of the world in a permanent league in which they are pledged to use their united power to maintain peace by guaranteeing right and justice.

GUNS BOOM, PLANES FILL AIR; FRENCH CROWDS CHEER PEACE

GERMANS PLEDGED TO ENFORCE TREATY; NO RESERVATION

Delegates in Statement Say Nation Will Earn Right to Place in League.

VERSAILLES, June 28.—Foreign Minister Muller and Colonel Wilson held German representatives at the Treaty table under the following statement to the United States:

"We are signing without mental reservation. What we are signing will see every nation in peace in the future."

"We believe the Germans will do their own domestic and in accordance with the terms of the treaty, or they will see the Treaty is impossible of execution."

"We believe the Germans will not insist on delivery of the Rhine and other high officers."

"The Central Government will not insist on any other point."

"Germany will make every effort to give herself worthy to enter the

Expresses Sympathy for People, With Belief in Her Future Confirmed.

PARIS, June 28.—President Wilson today, on the eve of his departure from France, made the following statement:

"As I look back over the terrible conflict I have spent in France my memory is not of conferences and hard work done, but one of the sympathetic acts of generosity and friendship which have made the last few months the most beautiful of my life toward the people of America, and how fortunate I have been to be the representative of our people in the midst of a nation which knows how to show us kindness with so much grace and so much open recognition of what is in the heart."

VERSAILLES, June 28 (Associated Press).—The World War was formally ended to-day by the signing of the Peace Treaty with Germany.

The epochal meeting in the Hall of Mirrors began at 3.10 o'clock. The treaty was signed by Dr. Hermann Mueller at 3.12 o'clock (9.12 New York time) and by Johannes Bell at 3.13 P. M. They were followed by the American delegates, headed by President Wilson, and then by the plenipotentiaries of Great Britain, France, Italy and Japan. The representatives of the minor powers, signed in alphabetical order.



Reset what it means: Peace vs Tribalism.

Living in Peace does not mean that we are not fighting, it means that the war is over. When wars end, there tend to still be skirmishes with people who don't know the war is ended, or who can't accept their side lost. Peace means the war is over legally-officially, not the fighting. When the civil war ended, we were no longer enemies but now back on the same side, the same team. The Bible is clear that our war is not with other people but against principalities and wickedness in high places (Eph. 6:12).



Jesus and Stephen...

Jesus and Stephen knew that when they said Father forgive them for the people killing them at the time. Jesus was signing the peace treaty between man and God through his blood, Stephen was reflecting Jesus and fighting one of the skirmishes once the war was over... The Jews just didn't know it yet. For Blacks in the US, Juneteenth (when Texas Slaves found out about their Freedom) happened over a year and a half after the emancipation proclamation. Slaves were free, they just didn't know it yet, and those holding them were not accepting that truth until after the south actually lost the war, and in the hearts of some, not for a long time after that.



External vs Internal Peace

- **External Peace is a fact of signed treaties, Internal peace is enacted when we internalize what that external peace actually means, and act accordingly. It may mean fighting against those who don't know the war is over yet, not that they die, but hopefully that they repent and see that there is only one Group- Image bearers of God . There are different teams and kingdoms, and we get to choose to be on God's Team with Jesus as our captain or not. We should not be at war with each other but because of tribalism often we do keep fighting. The losers of a war must accept the terms of the peace on the winner's terms. Jesus fought for us, and won externally- We have to accept those terms if we truly want peace internally.**

⁴ Therefore, those who had been scattered went about ^[b]preaching the word. ⁵ Philip went down to the city of Samaria and *began* proclaiming ^[c]Christ to them. ⁶ The crowds with one accord were giving attention to what was said by Philip, as they heard and saw the ^[d]signs which he was performing. ⁷ For *in the case of* many who had unclean spirits, they were coming out *of them* shouting with a loud voice; and many who had been paralyzed and lame were healed. ⁸ So there was much rejoicing in that city.
